### Which sponsor is right for me?

Choose a sponsor whose research goals align with the goals of your project.

Resources to help determine compatibility:

- Mission Statements
- Frequently Asked Questions
- Previous awards

Once you've found your sponsor, you can read through the funding opportunity announcements (FOA) they've posted.

#### THE DNA OF AN FOA:

**FOA = Funding Opportunity Announcement, also known as Request** for Proposals

#### **Key Components:**

- Program synopsis/description
- Deadlines and due dates
- Eligibility
- Award amount

#### **SPIN**

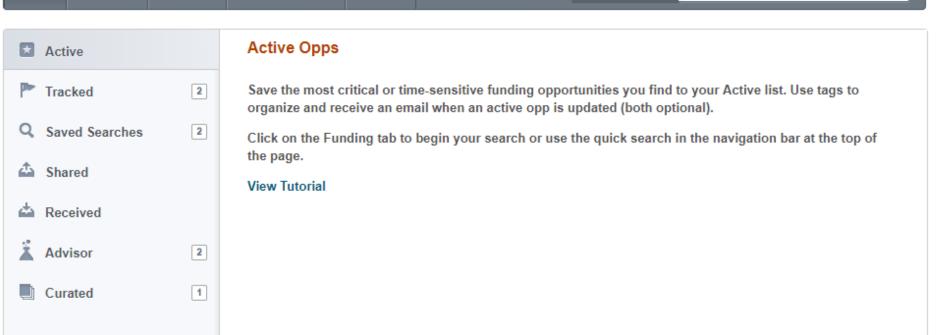
- o SPIN (Sponsored Programs Information Network) is a searchable database containing detailed information about grant programs from more than 1,200 different federal and non-federal sponsoring agencies.
- Over 31,000 funding opportunities.

#### **SMARTS**

- SMARTS (Spin Match and Retrieval Systems)
  - Automated program announcements
  - Notifications based on saved SPIN search criteria

- Keyword and term searches
- Double check preferences
- •Get creative and be flexible
